

## **PHILIPPINE FISHERIES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

### **HIGHLIGHTS OF ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT CY 2012**

Hereunder are the salient features of our Agency's accomplishments for the period in review:

#### **I. ON THE OPERATION OF THE REGIONAL FISH PORT COMPLEXES AND MUNICIPAL FISH PORTS**

- A. Pursuant to its mandate, PFDA sustained the operation of the eight (8) Regional Fish Port Complexes (RFPCs) and one (1) Municipal Fish Port (MFP).
- B. From January to December 2012, the total volume of fish unloaded at the regional fish port complexes maintained by PFDA reached a total of 332,143 metric tons (mt). Of this total, about 42% was handled by the General Santos Fish Port Complex (GSFPC) while the remaining 58% was contributed by the other six (6) regional fish port complexes. There was no fish unloading in Camaligan Fish Port Complex (CFPC). Total number of fishing and non-fishing vessel arrivals reached 60,324, a 23% increase compared to the last year's total of 48,877.
- C. Insofar as processing activity is concerned, 2,418 mt of fishery products were processed in Zamboanga, Camaligan, Davao and General Santos Fish Port Complexes. Moreover, the total volume of ice produced at the five (5) RFPCs was recorded at 45,723 mt.
- D. Volume of fish unloaded and transshipped at Infanta Municipal Fish Port in Quezon reached 4,774 mt, a 49% increase compared to last year's record of 3,211 mt. On the other hand, commercial and municipal fishing vessel arrivals reached 1,713. To date, a total of seventy five (75) MFPs were turned-over to LGUs nationwide.

#### **II. ON THE OPERATION OF THE ICE PLANT AND COLD STORAGE (IPCS) PROJECT**

In line with the government's privatization scheme, PFDA leased out various ice plants and cold storages to the private sector. To date, there are ten (10) IPCS that were leased out nationwide.
