

# **PHILIPPINE FISHERIES DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY**

## **HIGHLIGHTS OF ACCOMPLISHMENT REPORT**

**First Quarter, 2020**

Hereunder are the highlights of our Agency's accomplishments for the period January to March 2020:

### **1. ON THE OPERATION OF THE REGIONAL FISH PORT COMPLEXES AND OTHER FISHERY POST-HARVEST FACILITIES**

Pursuant to its mandate, PFDA sustained the operation of the nine (9) Regional Fish Ports (RFPs) and one (1) Municipal Fish Port (MFP) jointly managed by PFDA and LGU.

In the first quarter of 2020, the total volume of fish unloaded at the regional fish ports maintained by PFDA reached a total of 126,241 metric tons (Mt). The General Santos and Navotas Fish Ports were the two (2) biggest contributors to fish unloading. Of the total, 44% were handled by the General Santos Fish Port Complex (GSFPC), 41% of the Navotas Fish Port Complex (NFPC) while the remaining 15% was contributed by the other seven (7) regional fish ports. Total number of fishing and non-fishing vessel arrivals reached 12,418.

Insofar as processing activity is concerned, 489 Mt of fishery products was processed in the refrigeration facilities of General Santos, Zamboanga and Camaligan Fish Ports. Moreover, the total volume of ice produced at the four (4) RFPs was recorded at 7,288 Mt.

To date, a total of 134 fish ports were constructed/rehabilitated/improved by the PFDA nationwide. The construction of Bulan Fish Port in Sorsogon is practically completed and it is managed by the agency. Also, Tacloban City Fish Port in Leyte is jointly managed by PFDA and the LGU. In line with the government's privatization scheme, PFDA continued to lease out four (4) ice plants and cold storages to the private sector located in the provinces of Masbate, Negros Occidental, Sultan Kudarat and Surigao del Norte.

### **2. ON THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FISH PORT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**

In consonance with the directives of the DA Secretary William D. Dar, specifically in the pursuit of the modernization of the agriculture and fisheries sector, the agency has five (5) rehabilitation and improvement/upgrading projects for its regional fish ports under the Build Build Build Program.

Currently, the implementation of the rehabilitation and improvement projects of Iloilo, Lucena and Davao Fish Port Complexes is on-going. While, the preparation of Detailed Engineering Designs for the rehabilitation and improvement/upgrading of Zamboanga and Navotas Fish Port Complexes are in-progress. Also, the construction of Dolores Fish Port in Eastern Samar was completed, while the construction of eight (8) other fish ports is still ongoing on various percentages of accomplishment. These projects will all strengthen the competitiveness of the sector upon completion in 2022 and 2023.

Aside from fish port development program, the agency has specific plans for 2020 that are anchored on the increase competitiveness and ease of doing business. The following activities in the plan are as follows:

- A. Conduct of a third party client satisfaction survey on four types of clients operating in the agency managed fish ports;

- B. Continue to pursue ISO certification and re-certification of the six (6) operating units and central office' business unit to observe the quality management system of international standards. The ISO 2015 certification of Project Management Service in the Central Office and submission of the Revised Citizen Charter was done in compliance with RA 11032, the ease of doing business law. During the first quarter of 2020, the agency observes the processes in the conduct of the operation;
- C. Development and installation of two administrative systems; and
- D. Continuous conduct of training to achieve 88% of the incumbent personnel meet the required competencies of the position based on the approved Competency Framework.

### 3. ON THE SERVICES PROVIDED DURING THE ENHANCED COMMUNITY QUARANTINE

In compliance to the announcement of the Enhanced Community Quarantine order of the President, the following are the initiatives and actions taken by PFDA that aims to fight against or mitigate the impact of COVID-19 to our stakeholders and our port operations:

- A. Implemented the following measures to prevent or suppress further transmission and spread of COVID-19 during the Enhance Community Quarantine (March 17 – April 16, 2020):
  - Wearing of personal protective equipment (PPEs)
  - Body thermal scanning
  - Sanitation tents for port users entering the fish port
  - Sprinkler system for vehicles entering the fish port
  - Disinfecting/Flushing of roads, offices, market halls and food areas
  - Provision of footbath at the entrance of the market halls as well as hand washing facility at designated areas.
  - Implement wearing of face masks, white rubber boots and white T-shirts among port workers and market trading participants.
  - Reinforced port security and strict implementation of security measures.
  - Provision of authorized pass to port users/workers/fish traders/guests and strict implementation of “No Pass No Entry” policy.
  - Adjusted fish trading hours in observance to the curfew time.
  - Provide queue lines/guides at the NFPC pedestrian entrance to ensure compliance with social/physical distancing requirement
  - Issue “isDA on the Go” and Food Lane stickers and implement use of passenger manifest forms to ensure the mobility of fish haulers/viajeros in the transport/distribution of fish supply from NFPC to destination points in Metro Manila and nearby provinces.
  - Implement modified traffic flow management scheme to facilitate the ingress/egress of transport vehicles while implementing necessary precautionary measures
- B. Implemented measures to ensure fish availability, affordability, and its distribution to market destinations
  - Implemented the “Business as Usual” operations in all PFDA Fish Ports.
    - The total volume of fish unloading from all the eight (8) regional fish ports from March 22-31, 2020 is **18,815.22 metric tons**.
    - Major Fish Specie by Port and the corresponding Price Range in peso per kilogram (*Please see attached Annex 2*)

- Implemented ***isDA ON THE GO ni Ani at Kita*** – Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) Project of PFDA. This Project is in partnership with the Navotas Fish Port Complex (NFPC) private fishing companies such as Fishing Mongers, Inc., LYRS Maritime Enterprises and Frabelle Fishing Corp. This project has 4 modalities which include the following:
  - Retailing Market in 18 Waltermart outlets;
  - PFDA-NFPC CSR;
  - Tie-up with KADIWA on Wheels of DA;
  - On-line shopping at the NFPC.
  
- Intensify linkages with the Local Government Units (LGUs) and Armed Forces of the Philippines for the maintenance of peace, order, public health, and safety regulations
  
- Regular Correspondence with the stakeholders on upgraded health and safety measures within the fish port premises.
  
- Installed and activated PFDA Hotline (#1525) to address queries/concerns on PFDA and its fish port operations as well as handle transactions/matters pertinent to on isDA on the GO operations.
